The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Water Resources Division (WRD), proposes to reissue a permit to the City of Bronson for the Bronson Wastewater Treatment Plant located at 408 Mill Street, Bronson, Branch County, Michigan 49028. The applicant collects wastewater from the City of Bronson. The applicant discharges treated municipal wastewater to County Drain #30.

The draft permit includes the following modifications to the previously-issued permit:

The following conditions have been added: Quantification Levels and Analytical Methods for Selected Parameters, Inflow and Infiltration Reduction Plan, and Storm Water Pollution Prevention (not required). Required daily reporting for Carbonaceous Biochemical Oxygen Demand (CBOD₅), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Ammonia Nitrogen (as N), Fecal Coliform Bacteria, Total Phosphorus (as P), and Total Suspended Solids Minimum % Removal is now specified. 12-Month Rolling Total reporting has been added for Total Phosphorus (as P). The following seasons have been added for Dissolved Oxygen: May – November and December – April.
